He writes of how our afflictions lead us to endurance, and how endurance brings about character, and how it is our character (our inner values) that brings us to hope and trust in God's wisdom rather than in our own. In so many ways, it is the power and presence of the Holy Trinity making us new.

# Dear Padre,

What does the Church teach about respect for the body after death? Is burial the most respectful? It's certainly the most expensive. What about donating vour body to science? Or cremation? If someone is cremated, can the ashes be kept respectfully by a family member, or do they have to be buried?

Your question serves as a summation of current practice and exposes the real-life dilemma and choices facing loved ones: "How can I be respectful and at the same time practical?"



Catholics believe that the body of the deceased must be respected and not simply disposed of without care or concern. Current practice allows for burial, cremation, and the donation of the body to science, and choices depend in large part on tradition, culture, and economic circumstances. If someone chooses to donate to medical science, it is with the understanding that the body will be cremated or properly buried. If cremation is the chosen option, proper burial of the cremains in a sacred place is required.

All of this assumes an uneventful passing of the deceased person. It does not account for war, disease, or disaster. When faced with ordinary, rather than extraordinary, circumstances, loved ones have a real opportunity to be grateful and thankful for the chance to mourn, grieve, and show respect for the person. Unfortunately, that is not always the case in today's world.

# PROPOSED PROJECT

# ST. MARY'S HANDICAP ACCESS LIFT

Several options have been researched for Handicap Access to our Church and Hall. The chosen option is to install a Savaria V-1504 Vertical Lift Platform. A lift platform is similar to an elevator but it does not have full height walls or a ceiling. The lift will accommodate a wheelchair with one accompanying person, or three adults. Capacity is up to 750#.

The lift will be accessed from an exterior door with a keypad lock. The location of the door will be north of the bell tower where the "Priest Parking" sign is located. The glass basement window and the stained glass window in the baptismal area will be removed to cut in a doorway. We think the stained glass window can be raised and reinstalled.

After entering the lift, you can go up to reach the Church floor level, or you can go down to the hall. It will keep walking to a minimum.

When going up to the Church level, the lift will enter the baptismal area. There will be a self-opening door when you reach the floor level.

To reach the basement, you just use the lift again. At the basement level, you will exit a self-opening door into the hall. You won't have to go outside to reach the basement.

Our parish has a definite need of access for our parishioners and visitors. The total cost of the Lift and Construction is \$60,000.

We currently have donations and pledges totaling \$25,000.

Our balance needed is \$35,000.

A qualified charitable distribution is not taxed, so the charity receives 100% of your donation. QCDs may also count toward the <u>required minimum distributions (RMDs)</u> that are required depending on your age.

You can set up monthly, quarterly or yearly donations to any charity of your choice. It is an excellent way to donate to your Church or any other charity. Check with your tax professional to see if a QCD is advisable for you.
